Barriers for SMV's etc.

- Drive towards larger projects (>1 mill. Eur)
- Priorities for local authorities (easy, stable)
- Difficult to overview existing projects, particular problem for smaller partners
- (administrative complex)
- Large co-financing

- Some support for smaller partners can increase the outcome of a programme, while reliance on large, in particular multinational partners can be problematic

Recommendations, ideas

- Low minimum grant (50,000 Eur)
- Independant Central Agency for smaller grants (but agencies are not only good; they can increase administrative burdens)
- · Equal access for all, in general
- Budget line with less co-financing for smaller partners (SMV's, NGO's etc.)
- · Evaluation of results according to size
- · BUT, the funds must be there
